

Poster Guidelines

The purpose of the poster is to announce to the school and to the community the theme of your project. Consider the following elements as you think about what your poster should look like:

- How can I incorporate the theme of my project into my poster?
- What can I do to make my poster unique?
- What can I do to make my poster eye-catching?
- What colors do I want to use to make my poster stand out or would black and white be more dramatic?
- What pictures could I use to add to the visual affect of my poster?
- What style of font would be easy to read but still befitting of my project?
- Would it be beneficial to add a three-dimensional perspective?
- How can I use borders to offset text and pictures?
- What is the perfect title for my poster?

While each poster's appearance will be unique to the project theme, all posters must adhere to the following guidelines:

- All text must be TYPED
- Name and CWP period must be typed in the lower right hand corner
- Proper title
- Creative (eye-catching and thought-provoking)
- Obvious Effort
- Error-free
- Borders used to offset text and pictures
- Professional and high-quality appearance
- Consistent with project theme
- Poster must be standard poster board size (28" by 22")
