

## **MLA Documentation – Works Cited**

Below are examples of Works Cited formats. Follow the punctuation and spacing **exactly**. If the source you are using does not contain the called-for information, simply skip it and continue on. The entry begins at the left margin. If the entry is more than one line, the second and subsequent lines are indented one tab (or ½ inch). This is called a hanging indent. To see an example of this, go to the “Internet Article” entry.

When compiling the Works Cited page, entries are alphabetized by the first letter in the entry. All entries are double-spaced. There are no extra lines between entries. The categories (“Book”, “Magazine” are for this paper only – do not put those on your works cited!!!)

### **Book**

Last Name, First Name. Title of Book. City of publication: Publication company, year.

#### **Examples:**

Morris, Robert. Our Posthuman Future. New York: Farrar, 2002.

#### **Book with 2 authors example:**

Eggins, Suzanne, and Diana Slade. Analyzing Casual Conversation. London: Cassell, 1997.

### **Article in Reference Book (Encyclopedia)**

“Title of Article.” Title of Book. Edition. Year.

#### **Example:**

“Mandarin.” The Encyclopedia Americana. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 1989.

### **Magazine - PRINT**

Last Name, First Name. “Title of the article.” Magazine Title Date: Pages.

#### **Example:**

Trumpener, Katie. “Memories Carved in Granite.” People Magazine 6 June 1998: 14-27.

### **Newspaper - PRINT**

Last Name, First Name. “Title of Article.” Newspaper Title Date: Pages.

#### **Example:**

Jeromack, Paul. “The Leonardo Cover up.” New York Times 13 July 2002: A13+.

### **Personal Interview**

Last Name, First Name. Type of Interview. Date

#### **Example:**

Rowling, J.K. E-mail interview. 10 Dec. 1998.

Pei, Alvin. Personal interview. 22 July 2004.

### **Internet Article**

Last Name, First Name. "Article Title." Name of web site. Date of posting/revision. Name of institution/organization affiliated with site. Date of access <URL>.

#### **Example:**

Poland, Dave. "The Hot Button." Roughcut. 26 Oct. 1998. Turner Network Television. 28 Oct. 1998 <<http://www.roughcut.com>>.

### **Online Journal or Magazine Article**

Author(s). "Title of Article." Title of Journal Volume. Issue (Year): Pages/Paragraphs. Date of Access <electronic address>.

#### **Example:**

Wheelis, Mark. "Investigating Disease Outbreaks Under a Protocol to the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention." Emerging Infectious Diseases 6.6 (2000): 33 pars. 5 Dec. 2000 <<http://www.cdc.gov/ncidod/eid/vol6no6/wheelis.htm>>.

### **Proquest Article**

Last Name, First Name. "Article Title." Magazine/Newspaper Date of Publication: Page. ProQuest. Place of Access. Date of Access <URL >.

#### **Example:**

Williams, Vanessa. "D.C. Votes to Limit Teenage Drivers." Washington Post 3 Nov. 1999: A1. ProQuest. Colville High School Library. 12 Nov. 1999 <<http://proquest.umi.com>>.
