Highly Capable Program

Colville School District

The following information explains the Highly Capable Program at Colville School District. In addition, it includes a consent form that gives Colville School District permission to test your student and, if your student qualifies, place him/her into the Highly Capable program.

Assessment Process: All nominated students are assessed using multiple instruments that may include cognitive ability test (e.g., CogAT), achievement tests (e.g., Smarter Balanced, STAR benchmark or other standardized tests), formal teacher rating forms (e.g., Scales for Identifying Gifted Students), and other district-approved materials.

Selection Policy and Procedure: Student profile information is gathered and includes information on cognitive abilities, academic performance, creativity, and other items of value in the assessment process. If the student qualifies for Highly Capable services, the parent/guardian will receive a letter of placement along with the CogAT score report.

Services: The Colville School District serves identified students from the point of identification through grade 12. Each student's services are reviewed periodically to ensure appropriate placement. The district utilizes an in-class program model that may include enrichment activities, differentiation of curriculum, flexible grouping, choice activities, and secondary course options. Parent or legal guardian permission is required before any special services or programs are started for an identified highly capable student.

Appeal Process and Exit from the Program: If a student is not selected for district-provided highly capable program services, a parent/guardian may request an appeal of the decision. This request must be submitted in writing to the district's Highly Capable Program Coordinator and include additional supporting evidence. The Appeal Form is available on the school district website. The Appeals Committee will consider all submitted appeals and make a final determination. Written notification will be mailed within 30 days of receipt of the Appeal Form. Decisions of the Appeals Committee are final.

A student or parent/guardian may decline services or may request the child be withdrawn from receiving highly capable program services. School district personnel may also request a child be reassessed (with parent/guardian permission) through multiple objective criteria to determine whether the program continues to appropriately serve the child's needs.
