

Do these traits remind you of a child you know?



- Unusually large vocabulary and complex sentence structure for age
- Enjoys solving problems, especially with numbers and puzzles
- Highly developed curiosity which may include asking probing questions
- Keen and/or unusual sense of humor for their age

These characteristics are often evident in gifted or highly capable students.

Should gifted services be considered?

Intellectually gifted students perform at remarkable high levels of intellectual ability - the top 3% or so - compared to others of their age and background.

They demonstrate outstanding levels of aptitude or competence in one or more areas. Because of their unique learning needs, these students are best served when they receive academic support that meets their specialized needs.

Colville School District provides a variety of appropriate services to students who qualify for the Highly Capable Program.

Any parent/guardian, teacher, student, or community member may nominate a child for highly capable assessment. Parent/guardian permission is required before students can be assessed for eligibility. The Highly Capable Program Nomination Form is available on the school district website, in school offices, and at the district office at 217 S. Hofstetter.

For students to be considered for the Highly Capable Program, nomination forms must be received by mid-April, annually.
